### THE LORD'S TEMPTATIONS

Luke 4:1-13

And Jesus, full of the Holy Spirit, returned from the Jordan, and was led by the Spirit into the wilderness, being forty days tempted by the Devil; and He did eat nothing in those days; and when they were ended, He afterwards hungered. And the Devil said to Him, If Thou be the Son of God, say to this stone that it become bread. And Jesus answered him saying, It is written, Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every saying of God.<sup>1</sup>

And the Devil, leading Him up into a high mountain, showed Him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time. And the Devil said to Him, All this authority I will to give Thee, and the glory of them, for it is delivered up to me, and to whomever I will, I give it. If therefore Thou wilt worship before me, all shall be Thine. And Jesus answering said to him, Get thee behind Me, Satan, for it is written, Thou shalt worship the Lord thy God, and Him only shalt thou serve.<sup>2</sup>

And he led Him to Jerusalem, and stood Him on the pinnacle of the temple, and said to Him, If Thou be the Son of God, cast Thyself down from hence: for it is written, He shall command His angels concerning Thee, to guard Thee; and in their hands they shall take Thee up, lest Thou dash Thy foot against a stone.<sup>3</sup> And Jesus answering said to him, It is said, Thou shalt not tempt the Lord thy God.<sup>4</sup> And when the Devil had ended all the temptation, he stood back from Him until a time.

In brief, the Lord from His earliest childhood up to the last hour of His life in the world, was assaulted by all the hells, against which He continually fought, and subjugated and overcame them, and this solely from love toward the whole human race. And because this love was not human but Divine, and because such as is the greatness of the love, such is that of the temptation, it may be seen how grievous the combats were, and how great the ferocity on the part of the hells. That all this was so, I know of a certainty.

### PASTOR'S NOTES

When the Lord went out into the wilderness after He was baptized, He was tempted. These temptations were just a fraction of what He endured throughout His life on earth. He overcame every single thing the hells ever threw at Him (see AC 1444.2).

In *True Christian Religion* the Lord's subjugation of hell and its result is likened to "a conflict with all the wild beasts on the earth and their slaughter and subjugation, until not one of them dares come forth to attack any man who is in the Lord" (TCR 123.4).

As we begin to prepare for the Easter season, we can think about and be grateful for what the Lord went through to save the human race. He did that then so we could have the freedom to choose to follow Him now. He did it because He loves us.

**Holy Supper:** This month we will have Holy Supper on Thursday, April 14 at 6:30 P.M. at the church and at 3:30 P.M. at the Old School Village lounge. This is a wonderful time to take Holy Supper as we think about the Lord Himself offering it to His disciples and saying, "This do in remembrance of Me" (Luke 22:19).

**Pastor's Council Meeting:** The Pastor's Council met on Tuesday, March 29. We discussed possible topics for next year's winter study, possible uses for vacant space such as some rooms in the manse and the office space in the church, how Caleb's Café might continue to support society fellowship over the summer, Feasts

of Charity for next year, supervision of children after church, and the recent article in New Church Life by Bishop Buss – *Standing for Marriage in Today's World*.

Regarding the supervision of children after church, discussion focused on how the onus is really on us as parents to keep an eye on our children. I will continue to look at different ways to make this easier. We are so blessed to have so many children at our services!

Regarding the bishop's article on marriage, we discussed it extensively. Gratefulness for his presentation of what the Lord teaches in the Sacred Scripture and Heavenly Doctrine regarding marriage and adultery was expressed. Our discussion also included a review of the status of the policies and practices in the General Church and Academy of the New Church that currently violate the Divine laws identified in the article. Hope was expressed that the article is just the first step in organizational reform.

I have written to Bishop Buss expressing our support and encouragement in the hard work of leading toward the reforms necessary for these institutions to be New Church. I am more confident than ever in the Lord's promise that in the New Church conjugal love will be re-established as it was among the ancients (CL 81). But it will of course be hard work on all our parts. As the Lord teaches us in *Conjugal Love 74*, conjugal love "has successively fallen away from its holiness and purity until it has become scortatory, but...nevertheless, there is hope of its being brought back to its primeval or ancient holiness."
