#### **JOSEPH, BEING JUST**

#### Matthew 1:18-23

And the birth of Jesus Christ was in this way: His mother Mary, being betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, was found with child from the Holy Spirit.

And Joseph her husband, being just, and not willing to expose her to public infamy, intended to send her away privately. And while he thought on these things, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, Joseph, son of David, fear not to take to thee Mary thy wife, for that which is begotten in her is from the Holy Spirit. And she shall bring forth a Son, and thou shalt call His name Jesus; for He shall save His people from their sins.

And all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was declared by the Lord through the prophet, saying, Behold, the virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a Son, and they shall call His name Immanuel, which is, being translated, God with us.

And Joseph, being awakened from sleep, did as the angel of the Lord had directed him, and took to him his wife, and knew her not, until she brought forth her firstborn Son; and he called His name Jesus.

It was necessary for [the Lord] to be born of a virgin in legitimate marriage with Joseph.

### **Athanasian Creed 99**

That [Jesus] was a carpenter's son, was because "a worker in wood" signifies the good of life from the doctrine of truth.

#### Pastor's Notes

Not much is said in the Heavenly Doctrine about Joseph, the husband of Mary. But the Lord gives us an idea of his character in the Gospels of Matthew and Luke.

Joseph is described as a just man (Matt. 1:19). And we can look at the other things we know about him in this light.

We can see why he was described as a just man in his marriage. He followed the ancient custom of betrothal in preparation for taking Mary as his wife (Matt. 1:18). After their betrothal, but before he knew Mary as a wife, Joseph learned she was with child and he sought to protect her from harm (Matt. 1:19).

We can see why he was described as a just man in how he responded to the angel of the Lord. Each time the angel of the Lord appeared to him he faithfully followed the angel's instruction. He took Mary to be his wife but knew her not until the Lord was born (Matt. 1:24-25). He named the infant boy Jesus (Matt. 1:25). He took the infant Jesus and Mary to Egypt to save Jesus from Herod (Matt. 2:13) and then he returned to the land of Israel with Jesus and Mary after the threat had passed (Matt. 2:20-21). Each time he did exactly what the angel of the Lord asked him to do.

We can see why he was described as a just man in how he acted as a father. Joseph was described by Mary as grieving over the twelve-year-old Jesus after having left him behind in Jerusalem (Luke 2:48). And it is reasonable to infer that he was a just man in his occupation as a carpenter as well (Matt. 13:55).

The Lord in His providence knew exactly who to pick to support Mary and provide for the Lord both as an infant and growing child.

What an example to follow!
