ACCEPTING THE KINGDOM OF GOD AS A LITTLE CHILD

Mark 10:13-16

And they brought to Him little children, that He should touch them; and the disciples rebuked those who brought [them]. But when Jesus saw [it], He was indignant, and said to them, Let the little children come to Me, and forbid them not; for of such is the kingdom of God. Amen I say to you, whoever shall not accept the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter into it. And having taken them up in His arms, and set [His] hands upon them, He blessed them.

Heaven and Hell 280

As innocence consists in being led by the Lord and not by self, so all who are in heaven are in innocence; for all who are there love to be led by the Lord, knowing that to lead themselves is to be led by what is their own, and what is one's own is loving oneself, he that loves himself not permitting himself to be led by anyone else. Therefore, so far as an angel is in innocence he is in heaven, in other words, is in Divine good and Divine truth, for to be in these is to be in heaven. Consequently the heavens are distinguished by degrees of innocencethose who are in the outmost or first heaven are in innocence of the first or outmost degree; those who are in the middle or second heaven are in innocence of the second or middle degree; while those who are in the inmost or third heaven are in innocence of the third or inmost degree, and are therefore the very innocent of heaven, for more than all others they love to be led by the Lord as little children by their father; and for the same reason the Divine truth that they hear immediately from the Lord or mediately through the Word and preaching they take directly into their will and do it, thus committing it to life. And this is why their wisdom is so superior to that of the angels of the lower heavens. These angels of the inmost heaven, being such are nearest to the Lord from whom they receive innocence, and are so separated from what is their own that they live as it were in the Lord. Externally they appear simple,

and before the eyes of the angels of the lower heavens they appear like children, that is, as very small, and not very wise, although they are the wisest of the angels of heaven; since they know that they have nothing of wisdom from themselves, and that acknowledging this is being wise. They know also that what they know is as nothing compared to what they do not know; and they say that knowing, acknowledging, and perceiving this is the first step towards wisdom.

PASTOR'S NOTES

Accepting the kingdom of God as a little child means simply following the Lord because He is the Lord. When we go to Him "as a little child" we go to Him because we know He is the Lord, believe what He says, and are willing to be led by Him because He is the Lord. We can then come to Him with the eagerness, the happiness and the confidence that we can picture the little ones with who came to Him in the Gospel of Mark. But, of course, it is not the same for adults as it is for children. In the New Testament, the Lord teaches us how to approach Him with this story about little children because children represent those who are in innocence (CL 414). And innocence, for adults, is a conscious and deliberate willingness to be led by the Lord (HH 281).

May the Lord guide us to innocently accept His kingdom as a little child.

The Board of Trustees met on Tuesday, February 18 and discussed the feedback from the update letter about the West End Renovation project and the possibility of spending about \$90,000 more from the Reserve Fund in order to do all of the kitchen renovations called for in the plan.

Some responses to the letter included dissatisfaction with spending more money on the project, but none of those responses included a request for a special meeting to discuss and vote on the board recommendation. Other responses were enthusiastic about going forward as recommended in the letter. After discussion the board decided to go forward with its recommendation as described in the letter.

The board also reviewed the status of the current fiscal year budget as well as the proposed budget for the next fiscal year. Additionally, the board discussed some long-term budget planning. The goals for our current fiscal year are well within reach and the finances for the church and school are in good shape. But the board also determined that additional endowment will be needed in order to sustainably fund additional staffing needs in the future.
