THE SPOILING OF THE NATIONS

2 Samuel 8:6-12

David set garrisons in Syria of Damascus, and Syria became servants to David bearing gift offerings. And Jehovah saved David, wherever he went. And David took the shields of gold that were with the servants of Hadadezer and brought them to Jerusalem. And from Betah, and from Berothai, cities of Hadadezer, King David took exceedingly multiplied bronze.

And Toi king of Hamath heard that David had smitten all the host of Hadadezer. And Toi sent Joram his son unto King David, to ask after his peace and to bless him, because he had fought against Hadadezer. For Toi was a man of war to Hadadezer. And in his hand there were vessels of silver, and vessels of gold, and vessels of bronze. These also King David sanctified to Jehovah with the silver and the gold which he sanctified from all the nations that he had subdued, from Syria, and from Moab, and from the sons of Ammon, and from the Philistines, and from Amalek, and from the spoil of Hadadezer, son of Rehob, the king of Zobah.

It is with man's memory-knowledges as with his riches and wealth. Riches and wealth are hurtful to those who are in evil, because they apply them to evil uses; but they are useful to those who are in good, because they apply them to good uses. If therefore the riches and wealth which pertain to the evil are transferred to the good, they become good. The same is true of memory-knowledges....Such [is] also signified by the spoiling of the nations in the land of Canaan and by the wealth, the herds, the cattle, the houses, the vineyards, which the sons of Israel there took for spoil. This is still plainer from the gold and silver taken from the nations for spoil being also applied to a holy use.

Pastor's Notes

As the school year starts up again, it's a good time to reflect on the purpose of knowledge, or memory knowledge as it is called in the Heavenly Doctrine.

We can ask ourselves, what is the purpose of learning?

We can see the answer to this question from the stories in the Word where the Israelites conquered other nations and took their wealth and used it to worship the Lord. The purpose of learning, in any environment, is to acquire knowledge and use it to serve the Lord.

When our goal is to serve the Lord, He will help us take the knowledge of the world and use it to serve Him. When we learn something new and ask the Lord to show us how that knowledge can serve Him, we are sanctifying it, just like David did with the vessels of gold, silver and bronze that he took from the nations the Lord led Him to conquer.

So let's approach this year looking to acquire new knowledges with the goal of serving the Lord with them even better than we have before.

Please stay on church property (toward the left as you travel the lane), and avoid driving onto our neighbor's property toward the right.

This year's Winter Study will be on a portion of the Sermon on the Mount where the Lord says six times in succession, "You have heard that it was declared by the ancients...but I say to you..." (Matthew 5:21-48). In *Apocalypse Explained* 746:17 the Lord says:

"This whole chapter treats of the interior life of man, which is the life of his soul, consequently of his will and thought therefrom; thus it treats of the life of charity, which is the spiritual moral life. This life the sons of Jacob knew nothing about before, because from their fathers down they were external men. For this reason also they were kept in the observance of external worship, according to statutes that were external, representing the internal things of worship and of the church. But in this chapter the Lord teaches that the interior things of the church must not only be represented by external acts, but must also be loved and done from the soul and heart."

I look forward to studying together how we love and do these interior things of the church from the soul and heart!

NOMINATING COMMITTEE
