IT ALL CAME TO PASS

Genesis 12:1-2

And Jehovah said to Abram, Go from thy land, and from thy birth, and from the house of thy father, to the land that I will cause thee to see.

And I will make thee into a great nation; and I will bless thee, and will make thy name great; and be thou a blessing.

Joshua 21:43-45

And Jehovah gave unto Israel all the land which He promised to give unto their fathers; and they possessed it and dwelt therein.

Divine Providence 6489

The Providence of the Lord has been conjoined with foresight, and the one is impossible without the other; for evils are foreseen, and goods are provided. And the evils which are foreseen, are by the provident disposition of the Lord continually bent to good, for the Divine end of good reigns universally. Hence nothing is permitted except for the end that some good may come out of it.

Pastor's Notes

In *Joshua* 21, upon the completion of the conquest of the land of Canaan it says, "Not a word fell from any good word which Jehovah had spoken to the house of Israel; all came to pass" (Josh. 21:45). But to understand what the Lord meant when it says, "it all came to pass," we have to go back to Abraham.

What came to pass is what the Lord promised Abraham over 500 years earlier. He promised to Abraham that if he went to the land that the Lord meant for him, he would be blessed and his progeny would become a great nation (Gen. 12:1-2). And

that is exactly what came to pass. As it says in *Joshua*, "Not a word fell from any good word which Jehovah had spoken" (Josh. 21:45).

The Lord has the same good word for us and for every human being too. Just as everything that happened after the promise that the Lord made to Abraham ultimately resulted in the conquest of Canaan over 500 years later, everything that happens to us in the course of our lives can be turned by the Lord toward good that will lead us to heaven if we are willing. As He teaches us in the *Arcana*, "nothing is permitted except for the end that some good may come out of it" (AC 6489).

The Winter Study Topic will be on a portion of the Sermon on the Mount where the Lord says six times in succession, "You have heard that it was declared by the ancients...but I say to you..." (Matthew 5:21-48). In *Apocalypse Explained* 746:17 the Lord says:

"This whole chapter treats of the interior life of man, which is the life of his soul, consequently of his will and thought therefrom; thus it treats of the life of charity, which is the spiritual moral life. This life the sons of Jacob knew nothing about before, because from their fathers down they were external men. For this reason also they were kept in the observance of external worship, according to statutes that were external, representing the internal things of worship and of the church. But in this chapter the Lord teaches that the interior things of the church must not only be represented by external acts, but must also be loved and done from the soul and heart."
